WYATT: After a life well lived, Jean Marion Wyatt, late of Carlyle and formally of Kisbey passed away at Carlyle, Sask. on Dec 27th, 2011 at the age of 84.

Jean was predeceased by her husband, Harold (1991); parents Carlos and Bertha Pollard; two brothers; four sisters; three brothers-in law; and two sisters-in-law.

Jean is survived by her children, Gerry (Betty) Wyatt, White Bear Lake; Connie (Bob) Milligan, Weyburn; Doug (Leanne) Wyatt, Kisbey; Sister Nora Singleton, Kisbey; 11 grandchildren; 17 great grandchildren; Brother-in-law, Jack (Pat) Wyatt, Kisbey; numerous nieces and nephews.

Jean was born April, 27th, 1927 in Kisbey, grew up and received all her education in Kisbey. On July 14th, 1948 she married Harold Gordon Wyatt and they purchased and settled on the Joe Hewitt farm SW of Kisbey. During the years on the farm they saw many changes from no power or sewer system to a highly mechanized farming operation.

During her children's school years, Jean was kept

busy attending and driving kids to ball games, hockey, football, curling, 4-H and music lessons. She also enjoyed gardening, baking, sewing, quilting, writing poetry and volunteering in the community whenever needed.

Jean and Harold enjoyed short holidays in Sask. and one very memorable trip to Hawaii-but for the most part they were content spending time in their small community and socializing with their farming neighbours. Attending all activities of their children and grand children was their priority.

Jean's greatest joy was babysitting her grand children and being with family and friends.

Harold passed away in 1991 and Jean remained on the farm until moving to Arcola in 1998. She now had easier access to the grand kid's school and sporting activities. Her home, once again, became the haven for many lunches, meals and sleepovers. Jean enjoyed her home and neighbours in Arcola taking pride in her well groomed lawns and flowers.

Due to sudden failing health in Dec. 2007, Jean had to leave her home and move to Moose Mountain Lodge in Carlyle. She appreciated the care she received from all the staff and enjoyed visitors.

On Tues. Dec. 27th, 2011, in early a.m., Jean passed away peacefully with family by her side. Jean (better known to all as Grandma Jean) will be missed by all and forever loved.

A funeral service for Jean was held Fri. Dec. 30th,

2011 2p.m. in Kisbey Recreation Centre, Kisbey, Sask. with Interment at Percy Cemetery.

Pallbearers were her six grandsons: Brad and Chad Wyatt; Cameron and Michael Wyatt; Devin Milligan; and Trevor Bravold.

LOTHIAN: Daniel George Lothian passed away at the Moose Mountain Lodge in Carlyle, Sask. on Friday, Dec. 23rd, 2011 at the age of 84 years.

Dan was born on Sept. 26th, 1927 to James and Florence Lothian at Gainsborough, Sask. He was the 2nd son in the Lothian household as his brother, Clarence, died in infancy. Thus he became the eldest of 7 more siblings: Dorothy, Ken, Warren, Marion, Ray & Ron (twins), & Ralph. They moved to Carlyle when Dan was 2 years old and he has resided in Carlyle ever since.

Dan married Marjorie Green on July 18th, 1953 at Wawota, Sask. Together, they raised 3 children. Bill was born in 1955, Joan in 1957, and Susan in 1959.

In his early years, he spent much time working on many farms, including his uncle's George & Lawrence. A year after he was married, he went to work with the Brady's and the Eaton's at Carlyle Motors. In 1964, he moved to the MacLeod's Store with Ted Brady for the next 8 years. In 1972, he and his brother, Ron, purchased the store from Mr. Brady and together, they continued this thriving business, serving valued customers throughout southeastern Sask. for the next 9 years. In 1981, he sold his share to brother, Ralph. For the next few years, he and Marj worked for MacLeod's National chain of stores, assisting them in company stores in Squamish, B.C. & Maple Creek, Sask. He returned to Carlyle on a full time basis, working at Skyline for a short time before moving back into MacLeod's to assist Ralph in a managerial assistant capacity before officially retiring in 1991, and daily routine of golf in summer and curling in winter whenever possible.

During this lifetime, he took an active role in his community, serving on many organizations. They included United Church Board of Stewards, Chamber

of Commerce, Town Council, Air Cadets, Local School Board, Moose Mountain Lodge Board, the Housing Authority, local Fire Brigade, and Curling Club Committees.

Dan was great family man. He followed the interests of his children. He and Marj truly enjoyed dancing, travelling, visiting with friends, and the cabin @ Whitebear Lake. He treasured the many holidays as it meant visits of his grandchildren and family. His keen sporting nature kept him busy with curling, and fishing, and golf. He always enjoyed a good game of cards, especially cribbage & whist, or dominoes. Later, with his Happy Gang bunch, pool and shuffleboard, were added. And he was an avid fan of the Riders, the Cougars, the Lakers, the Blue Jays, and the Leafs. He really enjoyed his TV sports and local home games whenever possible.

In 2000, his health began to fail as he was diagnosed with Parkinson's. He fought various battles with cataracts, back surgery, and skin cancer, living each day to its fullest. Finally, in 2010, he had to be admitted into nursing home care where he spent time in Arcola and Kipling Hospitals, Redvers, Stoughton, and eventually, Carlyle Care Homes.

He leaves to mourn his loving wife, Marj, his son Bill (Pat) of Assiniboia, his daughter Susan (Denis) of Regina, his son-in-law Don of Regina, and 6 grandchildren, Gord, Derek, Matthew, Janna, Joni, and Julie, along with brothers Ray (Wilma) & Ralph (Deb), and sisters Dorothy Brown and Marion (Jack) Irwin, brother in law Merton Bryant, & sister in laws Evelyn Green, Phyllis (Ed) Stephens, Marilyn Lothian, & Joyce Davidson along with many nieces, nephews, and cousins. He is predeceased by his parents, his daughter, Joan,

brothers, Clarence, Ron (Joan), Warren, Ken (Doreen), sister in law Madeline, brothers in law Harold & Allan.

A "celebration of life" was conducted on Sat. Jan. 7th, 2012 @ the Carlyle Full Gospel Church with Pastor Carl Rushton officiating.
